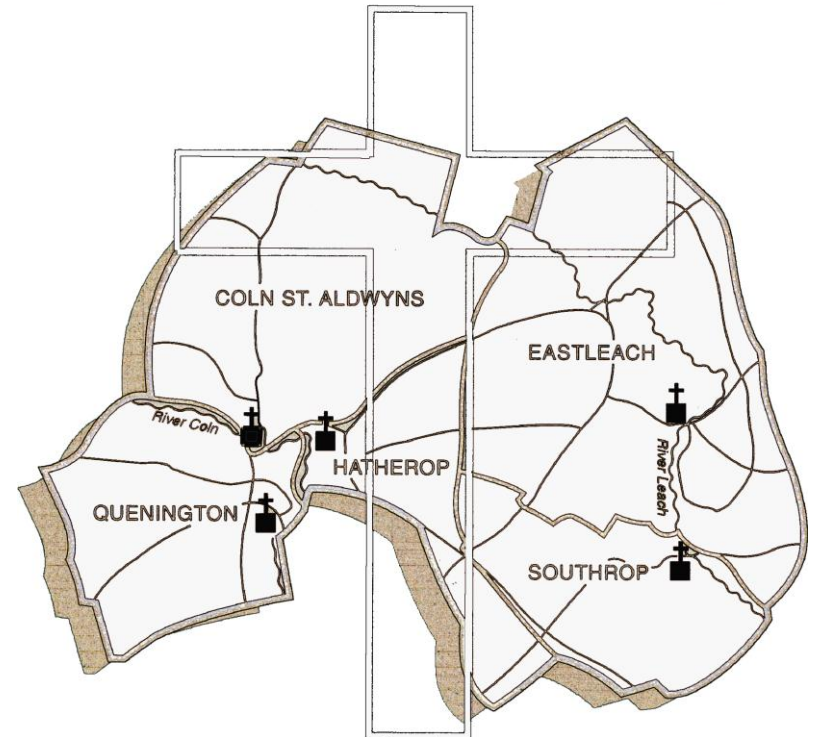

Journeys

The smells of a Lake District farm very powerfully remind me of the times I have spent there. Walking around the farm, the sights and scenes are so familiar: the dappled light in the woods, the vein of pink granite running through the crag and the stepping stones that bucked me into the river after a late night at the Newfield. When I visited last month it seemed nothing had changed, and yet so much had.

On an afternoon walk I couldn't resist swimming in a deep plunge pool below a waterfall in the gorge. The water was cold but wonderfully refreshing, always on the move navigating its way to the sea. There was a time I used to plunge my head into the water so that the sensation would momentarily stop me thinking about a situation that I couldn't change. Water, like time, rushing past... and we are powerless to stop them both.

Water in the river, and time, are always on the move and so are we. A reading that is sometimes chosen at weddings repeats the line, "Arise my love, my fair one and come away" a reminder that life is a journey and that we are constantly on the move - on the move physically, spiritually, emotionally. All our relationships are journeys too – journeys to new places and new experiences. Love is about calling to another and inviting them to journey with you, "Arise my love, my fair one and come away."

As we journey we can choose to invite others to join us. Sometimes we will face challenges and obstacles, like water encountering rocks and pools. At these times we will need to be conscious that we do not inadvertently lose contact with the important people who journey with us.
