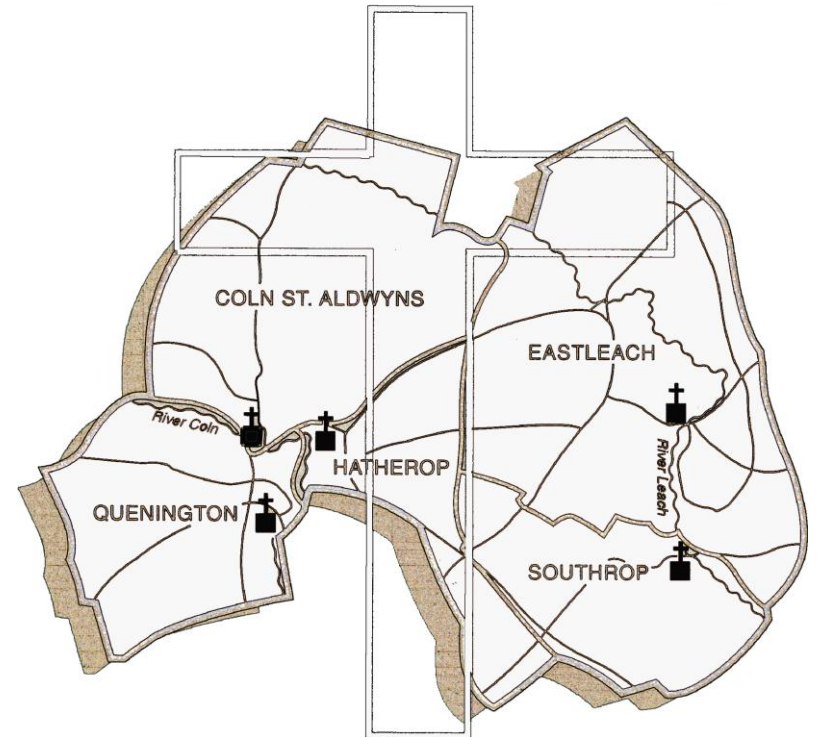

THE GATE ON THE GREEN REACHES 50 YEARS

By the mid-19th century, Quenington must have been a local centre of religion, when in addition to the Church of England, the village had a Brethren's Meeting House and a Free Chapel.

The latest chapter in a long history of non-conformism in Quenington was started in 1921 by two men who came to the village to preach.

By 1926, this little body of Christians bought a building on the corner of the green known as Gospel Corner for £150.

This former beer store and harness room was converted into a chapel, and every Sunday, for 34 years, services were held twice a day with Sunday school in the afternoon.

During the opening address of the Christmas Fayre December 3rd 1960, it was announced that the new Chapel, a church of stone, would be completed early the next year.

Six years of planning had come to fruition, with the land having been sold by Robert Meade for the nominal sum of £5, and the remaining cost of £4200 raised by local subscription and fund raising including the Christmas Fayres. Exactly one year after the first stone was laid, on the eve of Easter 1961, the chapel opened with a service of dedication.

Amongst the group of about 20 Evangelical Christians, Trustees, and Fellowship were some of those who had heard the preacher in 1921, and been baptised by them in the river at the bottom of the village. They were joined by more than 150 representatives of other Christian churches in the area, to rejoice and give thanks, on that memorable day.

Sadly, the services at the Chapel, (now known as The Gate on the Green) have ceased, but that need not be the end for the building.

We have an opportunity to keep this building, conceived and born out of the village and its people as an amenity at the heart of the village for the future of the village.

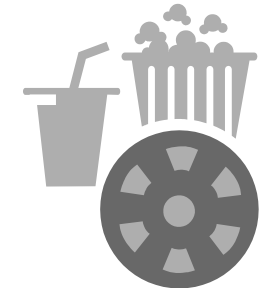
