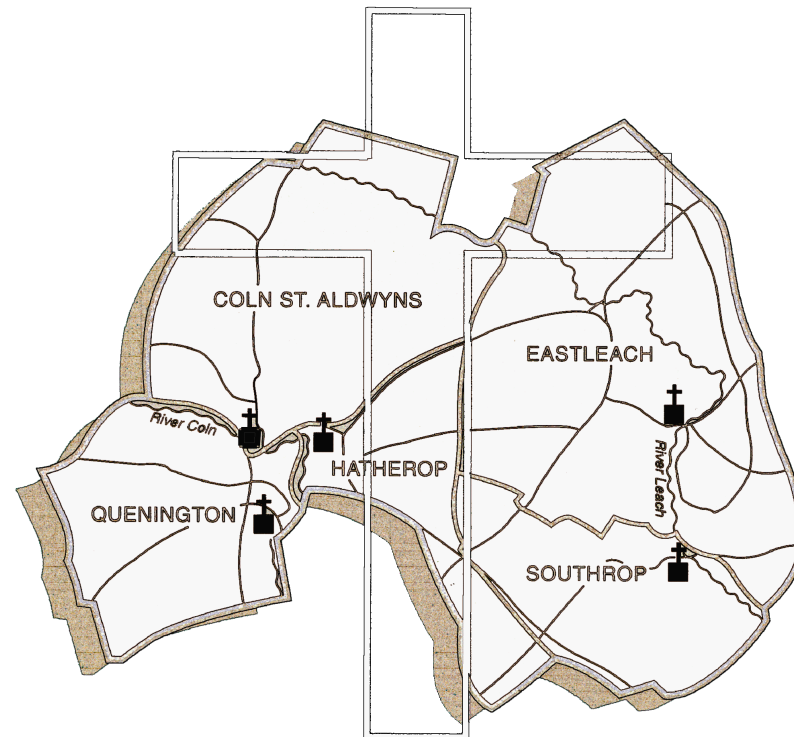

This year there are special services during June for just these festivals.

Thursday 2nd June, 7.30pm, Ascension Day, a service at Hatherop Church with the Coln Church choir for all the local parishes, when we come together as one.

Sunday 19th June, 6pm, at Hatherop, when the Bishop of Tewkesbury will join us for a Songs of Praise and dedication of the improvements to the building, made to make the Church more welcoming.

Sunday 27th June, 7pm, at Swyre Farm, Coln St Aldwyns, a special youth service lead by Toby Flint of Alpha UK and a visiting worship band.

Sunday 26th June, 6pm, at Swyre Farm, Coln St Aldwyns, when we will join with other local denominations for an informal thanksgiving evening.

Why not give one or all some of your time, and be surprised at how alive the Church can be when it truly praises our creator.

SOUTH COTSWOLD TEAM MINISTRY

Last month on Sunday 15th May a new Team identity was launched in a service led by Bishop Michael.

The identity uses 17 grains of seed, each representing one of the 17 parishes that make up the Team – to show we are people and parishes in partnership.



Together the grains create a radiating shape with a cross at its heart. Grain is an image used in scripture to represent life, growth and abundance it also echoes the agricultural heritage of our communities.

Although shown in black and white here the identity uses brown and beige because the Christian faith involves being rooted in our communities, the colours also depict the earthiness and charm of the Cotswolds.

We are grateful for designer Allison Murray for her inspirational design which you will find in all our churches.

THE COTSWOLD DECORATIVE AND FINE ARTS SOCIETY

The Cotswold Decorative and Fine Arts Society is pleased to announce its June 2011 lecture. The title is "Joseph Wright of Derby – a Great and Uncommon Genius", the lecturer is Nicholas Bagshawe.

Wright was an out and out Derby man and one of that small celebrated band of painters who made a national reputation outside the capital. His money was made by a successful portrait painting practice, producing highly direct likenesses of an increasingly affluent Midland middle class – very much warts and all. However he is best remembered for his observations of the scientific and technological advances of his day.

His "Philosopher giving a Lecture on the Orrery" and his "Experiment on a Bird in an Air-Pump" are quite outstanding – not only for their technological content, but for their highly unusual treatment. This lecture will look at all sides of this strikingly individual Midland painter and attempt also to place him in the context of his day – that of the 18th Century Enlightenment.

Nicholas Bagshawe trained at Sotheby's and spent all his working life as an art dealer. Currently he is dealing in 18th, 19th and 20th century pictures from gallery premises in London. He lectures regularly at Sotheby's Institute, the V&A, Southampton Institute and Tate Britain.

The lecture will take place on June 8, 2011, at Bradwell Village Hall, Burford OX18 4XF, and will begin at 2.00pm, with coffee and tea available from 1.15pm. Non-members are very welcome to attend, suggested donation is £8.

Please note, there are no lectures in July and August.

CHEQS GARDENING CLUB

Our visit to Broughton Grange last month was enjoyed by all as it was new to most of us and we had a bright, if chilly day.

Set in 350 acres of gardens, parkland and farmland, it had been owned by the same family for nearly 200 years, until bought by the present owners in

1992. The centrepiece is the 6 acre walled garden, previously a field, designed by Tom Stuart Smith in 2000.

The land has been terraced and has a strong structural planting of Beech, Lime and Yew, with water features and drifts of plants in the well-known style of the designer. Vegetables are grown for the owners, and there are productive greenhouses with peaches, lemons, apricots as well as peppers, chillies and aubergines. Vegetables are also raised from seed.

We were fortunate to just catch the Tulip display in the Parterre, nearly over due to the hot dry Spring. There were views to the new arboretum and the distant views beyond, a woodland walk with spring flowers, and the established garden in front of the house. The garden continues to grow and evolve and promises to be one we will re-visit (also open for the Yellow Book). We were shown round by Dan, one of the knowledgeable Gardeners, and enjoyed a cup of tea and cake along the route. Our visit ended with the opportunity to buy quality plants from their own nursery.
