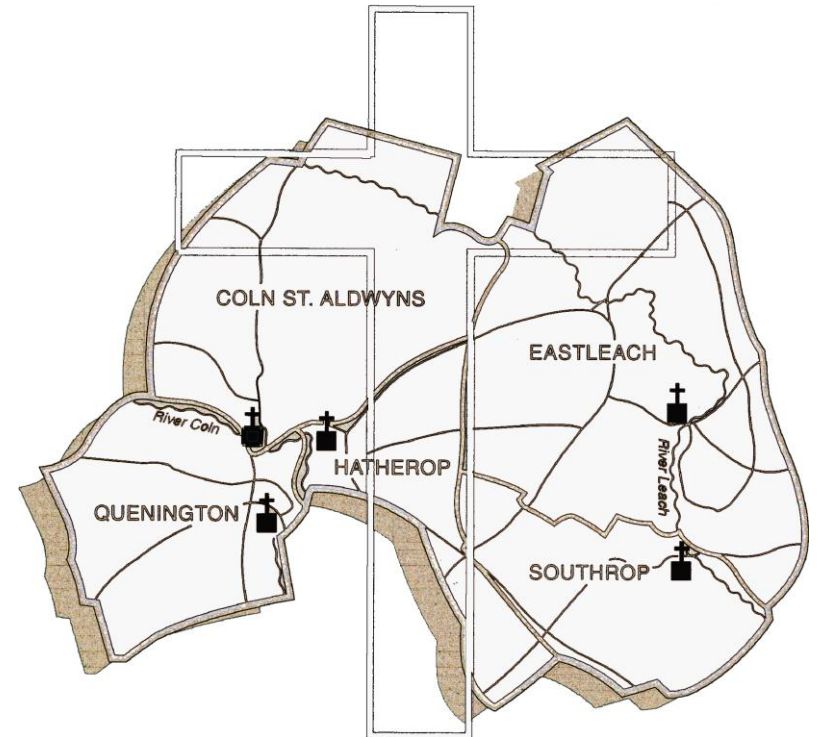

**Cotswold Churches Festival**

A lovely way to enjoy the countryside is by walking a long distance footpath like the Cotswold Way or the Thames Path. You can see the landscape gradually change, which even the building materials reflect. Every day on a walking trip I try to squeeze in as many miles as possible, walking for as long as daylight allows. It's hard to start really early when you stay in bed and breakfasts; even tents slow you down. I've found the best way to maximise walking time is to sleep rough. As daylight fades I look for somewhere out of the weather to roll out my sleeping bag and sleep. I've slept in all sorts of places: barns, sheds and churches. As I've fallen asleep I've sometimes thought what type of welcome the church verger would give me if he found me sleeping past the dawn in the church porch.

I hope you'll find a warm welcome whenever you visit one of the CHEQS churches, but especially so over the weekend of May 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> when all the churches in the CHEQS parishes will be taking part in the Cotswold Churches Festival. The CCF is an opportunity for churches throughout the region to open their doors and provide a warm welcome to visitors, whether they are coming from the immediate area or further afield. So far over 70 churches are taking part – including 13 in the Fairford Deanery. There are full details of Coln's choir concert, Hatherop's art exhibition, Eastleach's flower festival, Quenington's Church Fete and Southrop's Super Swap inside the magazine.

On Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> May, at 6pm, all the CHEQS churches will be supporting a special service in St Mary's Church, Fairford, which will be led by Bishop Michael. The service will honour the churches of our individual parishes whilst also celebrating the Fairford Team Ministry. During the service a new identity for the Team will be launched. Designer Allison Murray has created an identity that connects the life of the local church with the health of the wider church. Everyone is welcome to attend the service and any of the events over the weekend and throughout the Cotswold Churches Festival; just as you are welcome to visit any of our lovely churches at any time.

## THE COTSWOLD DECORATIVE AND FINE ARTS SOCIETY

The Cotswold Decorative and Fine Arts Society May lecture will take place on Wednesday 11th May in the Bradwell Village Hall, Burford. The title is *From Posset Pots to Pew Groups, Fashion for Collecting Early English Pottery* by Jane Gardiner. This lecture looks at the vitality and diversity of early English pottery from the first English delftware of the early 17th century to the development of Staffordshire white salt-glazed stoneware of the middle of the 18th century.

Jane Gardiner trained at the Victoria and Albert Museum and lectured in their Education Department. In 1987 she joined Sotheby's Institute, she became Senior Lecturer in 17th and 18th century decorative art before becoming Deputy Director of Sotheby's UK. 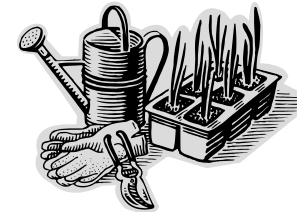
