I once introduced two friends to one another in some Cumbrian sheep pens. One, an elderly farmer, spoke with a thick accent and used lots of dialect words – gimmers and tups; the other was an academic from Oxford whose research area as a metallurgist was polymers. They both spoke English as a first language and yet to one another they were virtually intelligible. My ears had been tuned to their accents and my vocabulary gradually extended through my friendships with them so I could understand them both. It was strange to listen as they struggled to be understood and to comprehend.

A new nightclub in Wakefield called "Religion" offers club-nights called 'Resurrection' which promises to "bring your Friday back to life", Saturday is "Salvation - the answer to your prayers" and Monday Mass is offering "massive offers" on alcoholic drinks. Some people are not amused ... It challenges us to think about the words that we use, the meanings we attribute to them and the meanings others ascribe — which aren't always the same. Language is always moving: meanings evolve and change, new words appear whilst other words fall out of usage; apparently aerodrome, charabanc and gullible have all been omitted in the latest edition of Chambers.

We can speak the same language, use the same words but not be understood. Setting up a Twitter account I've been challenged to think about describing myself in the 140 characters allowed in the bio (biography): a brief description and statement of who I am. My bio gives, I hope, an honest and unambiguous summary, of my professional, personal and spiritual life.

I included joyfully because joy is one of the few Christian values that remains relatively uncorrupted and is understood by all. Joy comes from relationships rather than processions or experiences. Joy endures and fulfils: it is not based on external circumstances but something much deeper. Part of being a Christian is discovering joy and learning to live joyfully as a disciple.

This is the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it. (Psalm 118:24)

Survivorship - Living with and beyond Cancer

COLN ST ALDWYNS COMMUNITY SPEED CAMPAIGN

In 2009 the parishioners in Coln St Aldwyns completed a questionnaire which led to the production of a Parish Plan for the village. One of the major points of concern which the parishioners highlighted was the speed of vehicles travelling through the village. As a result Coln St Aldwyns Parish Council started a Community Speed Campaign with the help of Gloucestershire Police Constabulary. You may have noticed some of the Parish Council using a hand held device to establish speeds, also a Speed Data Recorder (SDR) was installed on Hatherop Road and monitored every vehicle's speed in both directions for a 5 day period. The main findings were:

- Vehicle speeds were lower when the hand held device was used.
- The number of vehicles doubles on a week day.
- The speed of vehicles travelling in the period 07:00 to 07:59 on a weekday increased. On one day over 60% of vehicles were recorded travelling at over 33mph, and 35% travelling at over 36mph.
- The number of vehicles using the Hatherop Road consistently increased from 15:00 on a weekday until after 16:00. Although recorded average speeds increased during this time period, even higher average speeds were recorded between 16:00 and 18:00.
- The highest speed recorded was 54mph at 20:25.
- The speeds recorded were markedly higher from Coln St Aldwyns towards Hatherop.
- The range of vehicle speeds on a weekday was consistent with the average spread for the day, however over the weekend the vehicle speeds varied more widely.

The Community Speed Campaign will continue and we ask all parishioners to continue to cooperate with us while we continue with this campaign.

Ride & Stride September 10th 2011


