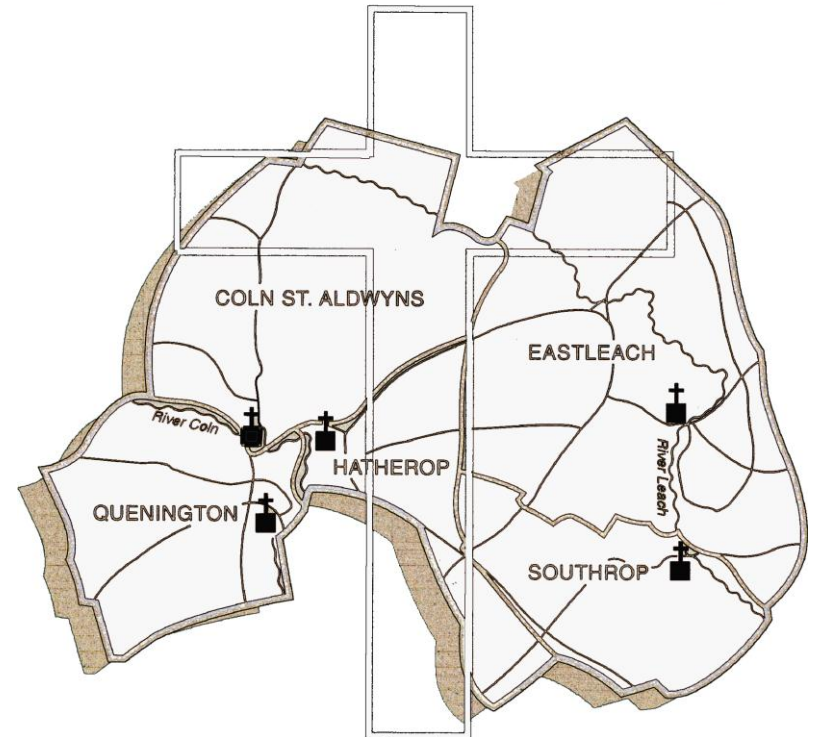

Preparations

Over the summer I have spent some happy hours preparing wood for the coming winter. I was getting nervous because although I'd ordered the wood months ago the timber yard hadn't been in contact. I was relieved when the call finally came. It took several journeys – the passenger seats were to be taken out of the car, the wood collected (being careful not to overload the car) the wood unloaded and stacked, the seats replaced and then finally the car vacuumed (well it will be soon). I'm proud of my wood stacks. The time I spent as a dry-stone waller helps. It's good to see the wood piled up knowing that the warmth of the sun will dry the wood out so that it burns well when it is needed in a few months time. How long does wood need to dry? When should we start to prepare for winter?

A report about private sector pension provision from the Workplace Retirement Income Commission concluded that up to nine million people, a third of the current UK workforce face a "bleak old age" because they are failing to prepare adequately for the future. When should we start to prepare for retirement?

If we're lucky we'll see many winters and we'll enjoy retirement but sadly there is no doubt all of us at some time will experience death. The church believes through Jesus we are offered a hope for eternity: death does not lead to oblivion but a new beginning. Moreover we can have a foretaste of eternity now (in the present) if we open ourselves to God. Which begs the question: when should we start to prepare for eternity?

For many of us September, the start of the academic year, seems a good time to begin new things and face new challenges. Life is full of ups and downs – inevitably some things will be unplanned but others will occur only because we have prepared. What will you do, what will you experience in the next twelve months?

CHEQS GARDENING CLUB

June visit to Moor Wood, Woodmancote. This was a follow-up visit after Henry Robinson's talk on Rambling Roses last Autumn at Southrop Village Hall. Moor Wood is tucked away in a rural valley, and Henry and Suzie have established and hold the National Collection of Rambling Roses, which they grow informally throughout the garden, along with nearly 100 other roses. Their beauty and scent was wonderful and Henry gave useful tips on feeding and mulching in the spring, pulling new growth horizontally to encourage flowering, pruning out 1 in 3 of old stems in late summer, shortening side stems by up to 2/3. Ramblers flower from old wood, climbers from new wood. We were given a delicious tea of Ginger Cake and Fruit Sponge, baked by Suzie, and served on the terrace in front of their lovely Georgian farmhouse, with a view over the orchard full of wild flowers. Our sincere thanks to Henry and Suzie for a lovely afternoon. **July visit to Stowell Park.** On a lovely summer's evening, we were met by Head Gardener, Neil Hewertson, who, with Lady Vestey over the last 26 years, has created the existing planting. Neil began his career as a Marine Biologist, then turned to Botany, but is mostly self-taught, and now designing other important gardens. We began on the terraces in front of the House, with spectacular views over the Coln Valley, with soft planting in blues and pinks so as not to compete with the view. There were Rugosa Roses, Lilies, Agapanthus, Phlox and Clematis, and the air was deliciously perfumed. Against the walls of the Ballroom was a Handkerchief Tree, beautifully trained, the only one in the country grown in this way. A steep bank beyond the House was planted specially for Butterflies, with Buddleia, Sea Holly and Wild Flowers. On a lower terrace, a new view had been opened up across the valley and an ornamental pond, built to celebrate Lord Vestey's 70th Birthday. Sturgeon, Rudd and Goldfish swam happily in their new home. A lower garden had informal planting of Malus and Cherry, with another pond fed by a natural stream, and a neatly clipped hazel tunnel. We visited the exquisite and peaceful Chapel containing original wall paintings from 1150, which were uncovered in 1928. Finally, we entered the magical walled garden, with mixed herbaceous planting, flowers grown for cutting, hothouses full of grapes and peaches for the table, and a fruit and vegetable garden, all immaculate and burgeoning with produce.

We were invited to bring our own picnics to enjoy in the walled garden - a wonderful end to a very memorable visit - and we are deeply grateful to Lord and Lady Vestey for their generosity. They requested that our entrance fees were sent to Maggie's Centre, Cheltenham. Our first meeting in September is on Tuesday 13th at 2pm - a visit to Chivel Farm, Heythrop, OX7 5TR. £7.50 to include refreshments.
