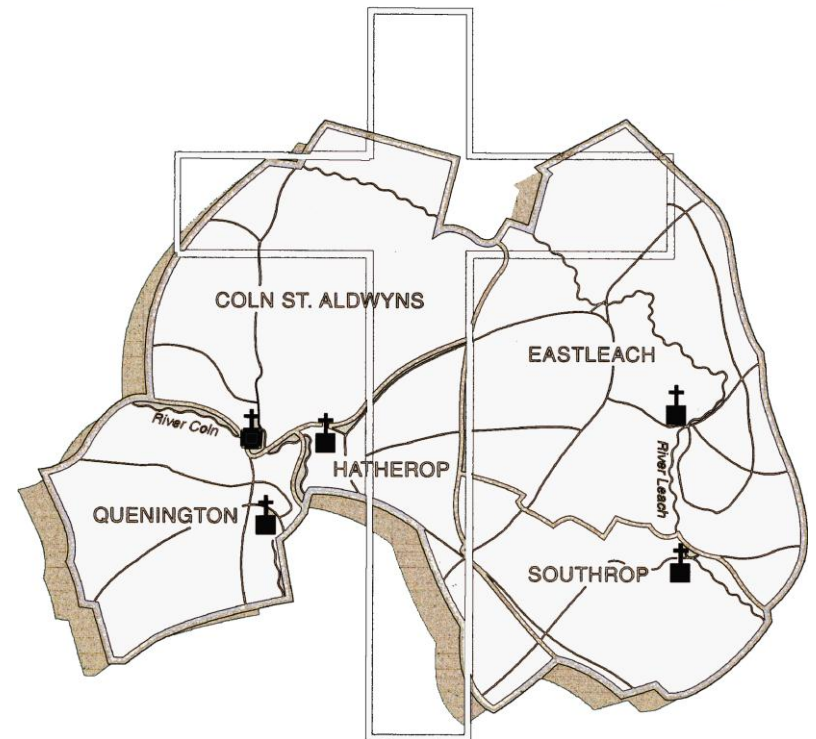

Chocolate eggs?

What does Easter mean to you? What does Easter mean for the church? Articulating meaning can be difficult. An advert in a major supermarket magazine delivered through the Vicarage door proclaims, “Easter isn’t just about chocolate eggs – let’s not forget the real thing!” This is followed by, “We’re the only retailer to offer Woodland eggs.” Apparently Woodland eggs, not Jesus, are the real thing at Easter! The real Easter message is about new life and rests on the authenticity of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

On Good Friday members of the local clergy team Revd Canon Chris Finlay, Revd Canon Ron Lloyd, Deaconess Patti Price and I will reflect on what difference Good Friday makes to us: our faith and our lives. Everyone is welcome to come and listen to all or part of these personal reflections revealing how we, people who share common beliefs can appreciate, relate to and be sustained by different aspects of Christ’s passion. Our response to Jesus makes no sense at all unless it impacts the way we live our lives.

It is sad how often the Easter message is misrepresented. People often describe God as a judge holding a set of scales on which our behaviour is weighed – and they hope that at the end of life their good deeds will outweigh their misdeeds, their future is in the balance. This is not the Easter gospel, this is not the God revealed by Jesus. God’s love is given freely without cost. The Easter message is that God dares to love us unconditionally and how this loves sets us free to live lives that are truly fulfilling

Those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint (Isaiah 40:31)

May you discover the life and promise of Easter

Trailquesting is orienteering on mountain bikes, and riders will have 3 hours to reach as many checkpoints as possible. Checkpoints are not manned, but are simply a small cable with a clipper attached about the size of a clothes peg, and are almost invisible if you are not competing. SNOWDROP VISIT

The planned visit in early February was delayed because of snow, but the Programme Secretary worked hard to re-schedule it for later in the month and members were delighted to see the garden at Barn Cottage, Shilton, at its peak, with thousands of snowdrops blooming in every area of the garden. Although there were Hellebores and Crocus, the Snowdrops were the stars. Dr Ron Mackenzie, a distinguished and very friendly Galanthophile, guided us round his garden. He explained the minute differences in the delicate blooms and gave us their names and histories. It would be too easy to say that Snowdrops are white! We saw snowdrops tipped with green and yellow and with leaves of every hue of green and grey. The garden was a real surprise, with paths twisting between trees and shrubs, and some beautiful stone sculpture. At the end of the garden, we all climbed onto a wall and then onto a flat upper field where huge rectangular beds were neatly composted and filled with yet more Snowdrops. Dr Mackenzie produces a catalogue of his Snowdrops, and we were amazed that the very rare varieties can cost £40-£50 a bulb! ARE YOU KNEELING COMFORTABLY?

A puffin and a hoopoe are strange creatures to find on church kneelers but they and over seventy other subjects were embroidered by Enid Money, a great gardener and devout Christian, and friend of St Swithins, Quenington. Enid's last work was snowdrops which she picked and embroidered straight onto her tapestry canvas. The swinging sixties taste in the Church of England was neo Arts and Crafts - carpet (blue or red) and nave walls white lime washed, annoyingly outlining the jagged stone surrounds to windows to show the 'natural' stone. Enid Money felt this severe and was impelled to create a colour blazing set of kneelers. Everyone was involved. Volunteers stitched around the main subject on each kneeler. This is an untold story of the sixties in the parishes of England. We are putting this art gallery on show over the Queen's Diamond Jubilee weekend.
