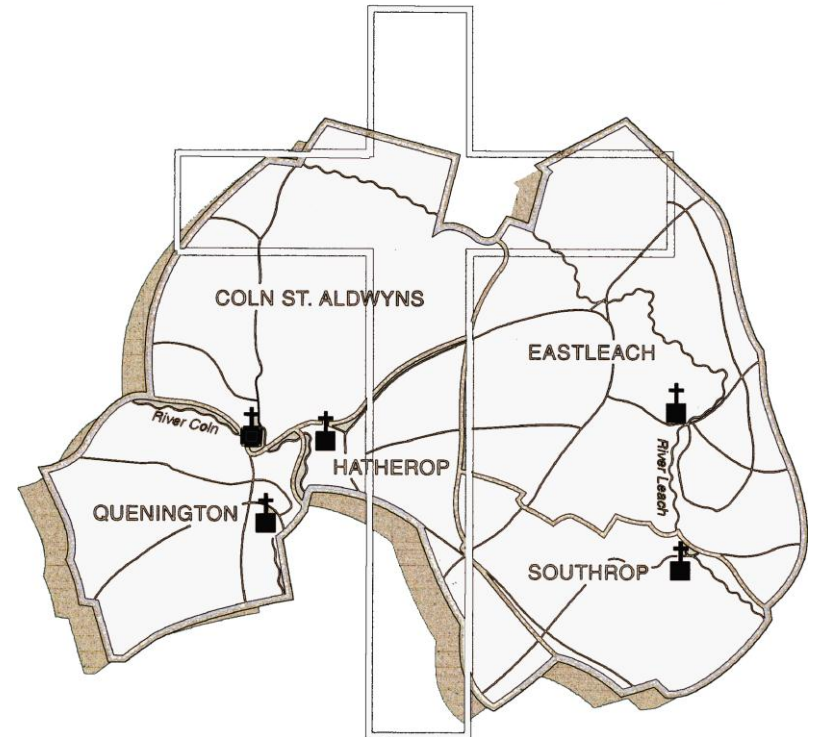

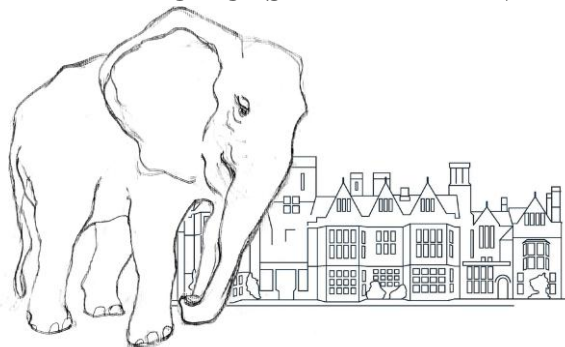

All households which are scheduled to receive a full collection of Refuse, Recycling, Food and (if subscribed to the service) Garden Waste on **Monday 26th December 2011** will, instead, receive it on Saturday 31st December 2011. Normal collections will resume on **Monday 2nd January 2012**.

NEW USE FOR HARVESTED TREES

In 1976, the Richardson family planted a 4-acre plot of poplar trees near Bryworth Lane cross-roads towards Lemhill. The poplars were grown as a crop that would have been harvested about ten years ago with a view to being sold to produce matchsticks for Bryant and May. However, between 1971-1980, four of the five Bryant & May factories in the UK closed down - in London, Northern Ireland, Gloucester and Glasgow. Because of these closures, the 13 square miles of poplar wood planted in England for matchsticks was now surplus to requirement. Now that the trees faced an uncertain future, they have been marketed for coffin building and pallet making, however the wood is considered too cheap for today's funeral directors, yet too expensive for today's pallet makers.

It is incidental to this background that consumers are being encouraged to use alternative energy, either for heating or electricity. With this in mind, we intend to cut down approximately half of the 4-acre plot, leaving a screen of trees along the roadsides. These poplars will then be turned into woodchip to be burned in a 133 Kw biomass boiler providing heat to the workshop units and cottages at Oxleaze Farm. Poplar woodchip is ideal for biomass boilers, as the wood releases minimal amounts of carbon dioxide during burning, when compared to the amount of CO₂ the plantation has ingested over the last 35 years. This means biomass is an environmentally sustainable way of creating heat - it also reduces our reliance on fossil fuels and an increasingly volatile gas supply. Once half the site has been cleared, we will manage the area for ash trees to regenerate, which will be a great improvement on the poplars that we have all enjoyed over the last 35 years.

AIR TATTOO TRIMS TONS OFF WASTE-LINE

Almost all the rubbish generated at this July's Royal International Air Tattoo at RAF Fairford has been diverted from landfill thanks to a recycling partnership between the airshow and a waste management company. This summer's Air Tattoo, which drew crowds in excess of 130,000, produced 66.98 tonnes of rubbish for disposal. Of that, 23.7 tonnes (38.47 per cent) was recycled. Almost all the remainder was converted into power through the national Energy-from-Waste scheme. During the past two years, the Air Tattoo has worked closely with Oxfordshire-based Grondon Waste Management to introduce new recycling initiatives including the collection of mixed recyclables such as cardboard, paper, mixed-colour glass bottles, plastic bottles and metal cans. To support the public initiatives, Air Tattoo organisers introduced an awareness campaign to encourage staff and their 2,000-strong volunteer army to recycle. Air Tattoo Site Manager Vince Sturt said: "The waste disposal statistics collected this year have been extremely encouraging with over 98 per cent of our waste diverted from landfill. Each year we try to increase the amount that we recycle and this really is a great effort. We encourage everyone - staff, volunteers and visitors to recycle as much as they can. Although we just fell short of our 40 per cent target this year we are still moving in the right direction. I am confident we'll reach it next July." Next summer's Air Tattoo on July 7-8 will see the airshow join forces with the Royal Air Force to stage a special Diamond Jubilee celebration in honour of Her Majesty The Queen. Gospel Corner, The Green, Quenington

Dear Villager

There is a move in the village to purchase the building known as The Gate on the Green as a replacement for the Quenington Village Institute.

The Quenington Institute has belonged to the village for over one hundred years, and has served as a public meeting hall. It has met the needs of the village over this time, however for a number of activities it is considered unsatisfactory and some of the user groups have moved out and up to The Gate on the Green. The Gate on the Green, now no longer used as a religious meeting place, has been placed on the market. This building is larger than The Quenington Institute, has two smaller rooms along with a large main hall, storage space, access and facilities for disabled people and is generally a more modern building. Answers to a questionnaire, issued to all households in the parish, indicate that the majority of villagers would wish the Gate on the Green to be the village community hall if this were possible. A committee of residents is currently looking at the financial implications of securing the building for the community and it is proposed that a decision to purchase The Gate on the Green will only be taken if a majority of residents indicate agreement by a ballot. It is however clear that such a move will require the village to raise a substantial sum of money due to the difference in the values of the two buildings. This is likely to be in the order of £100,000. so far we have a pledge of £15,000. Although no final decision has been made it is considered prudent to seek pledges of money to enable us to go forward with confidence that the money will be available. The committee is now asking members of the community to consider contributing by pledging a sum to the cause to ensure the community does not miss this unique opportunity. COLN ST ALDWYNS COMMUNITY SPEED CAMPAIGN

Coln St Aldwyns Parish Council has continued the Community Speed Campaign started in June 2011.

In June we monitored vehicle speeds on the Hatherop Road and more recently on the Aldsworth Road.

A Speed Data Recorder was installed for 10 days and recorded the speed of all vehicles on week days and a weekend, and with and without the Smiley SID installed. The main findings were:

- *Overall vehicle speeds were lower on Aldsworth Road at the weekend than on a week day.*
- *The number of vehicles increases by 40% on a week day.*
- *The number consistently increases from 8.00am until 9.00 and from 3.00pm until after 4.00pm.*
- *The speed of vehicles travelling in the period 7:00am to 8.00am on a weekday increased.*
- *On one day over 56% of vehicles were recorded travelling at over 33mph, and 35% travelling at over 36mph.*
- *Generally the speed of vehicles travelling towards Coln St Aldwyns was low, 15% travelling at over 33mph and only 8% travelling at over 36mph. This may have been due to the effectiveness of Smiley SID.*
- *The speed of vehicles using the Aldsworth Road was consistently higher for vehicles travelling away from the village.*
- *The highest speed recorded was 57mph at 22.46. Speeds recorded were markedly higher for those vehicles leaving Coln St Aldwyns.*
- *The range of vehicle speeds using the Hatherop Road was similar to those on the Aldsworth approaching the village.*

Smiley SID proves to be effective when used and Coln St Aldwyns Parish Council will be investigating if it may be worthwhile to purchase a second device.

The existing SID will be installed in different locations to maximise the effectiveness of the current device.

In addition we will be making enquiries to assess whether it could be possible to move the 30mph sign on the Aldsworth Road to a site further from the village and so avoid the vehicles speeding when leaving the village.
