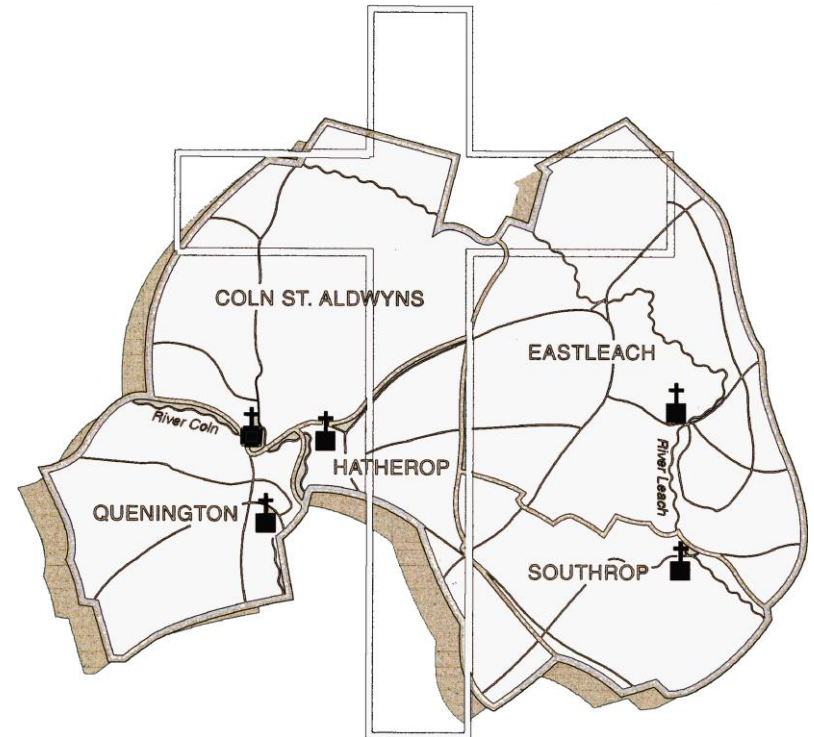

Dear Friends,

This July will be dominated by the Olympic Games. Whether you love or hate sport there must still be a feeling of admiration for the athletes who have prepared themselves in such a dedicated way, for a chance of a medal, and just a little pride if they are successful for Britain. Their intensity of training is something the rest of us will not really understand. I was reminded of another side to all this striving for success when I heard a commentator remark that no matter how gifted a sportsman was, it was no use if they did not have confidence in their ability.

Having confidence in ourselves and in what we do is essential if we are to carry through anything we set out to do. It is just the same with our lives of faith. We must have confidence in the presence and promises of Jesus in every situation of ordinary life, if what we believe in is to really influence the way we live.

At present, there is much criticism of the Church from many sources. From those who do not hold a faith and often do not want others to either; those who want the Church to speak differently; those who feel the Church is letting some people down by its beliefs. None of this is new. In every age the Church has had to adjust its response to the social context it exists in. Having said this, there are some fundamental features of belief which do not change. The love of God for humanity; the sacrifice and resurrection of Jesus as evidence of God's love and forgiveness and the hope the risen Jesus gives of a real purpose in living.

These we can have confidence in, always. The rest are subsidiary issues we must work out. We need not feel they undermine faith or that Christianity is failing. We will, as always, be asked to be dedicated in how we live in the light of God's love, as dedicated as any athlete in search of an Olympic medal.

The Church's primary role is to take the gospel of Jesus to the world. How the Church does this best is shown in the faithful lives of its members, not just by the actions of the Institution. To live by faith is to be as dedicated as any athlete. Dedicated to the love of God and our neighbour (both of which can be difficult) and dedicated permanently not just once every four years. So as St Paul said, keep faith and run the race of life with confidence, there is much joy to be found with God and it is of greater value than any medal.

THE GATE ON THE GREEN

The Quenington Village Institute Committee is buying 'The Gate' on behalf of the village. Our offer of £225,000 has been accepted. Everything is now falling into place and we can press on in earnest with fund raising, with the sale of the Institute and with giving 'The Gate' its new identity as 'The Village Hall' at the heart of our community.

During the last year we have been very busy holding open meetings, organising a questionnaire and a public vote where 94% of voters said 'yes' to acquiring the 'Gate'. So we started the process of buying the building and gaining planning permission for the Institute to prepare it for sale. The existing Institute has been regularly used over the years by residents of Quenington, Coln St Aldwyns, Hatherop and outlying areas. The new hall is ideally situated on the village green and is readily accessible by all three villages. Coln St Aldwyns and Hatherop parish councils and the Reverent Craig Bishop have expressed their support for the project and we have also been supported throughout the process by our ward councilors, Mike Wardle and Ray Theodoulou.

Although the financial situation is optimistic we do need to raise money. We have been offered a grant of £10,000 from the CDC Community Projects Fund. We are very grateful to fellow villagers who have been so generous and have so far pledged donations totalling £37,000 and to Lucy and David Abel-Smith who have donated a further £2,000 from proceeds of the sculpture show. We are also very pleased to have been offered a generous donation of £1,655 from the proceeds of the Quenington Village Fete this year.
