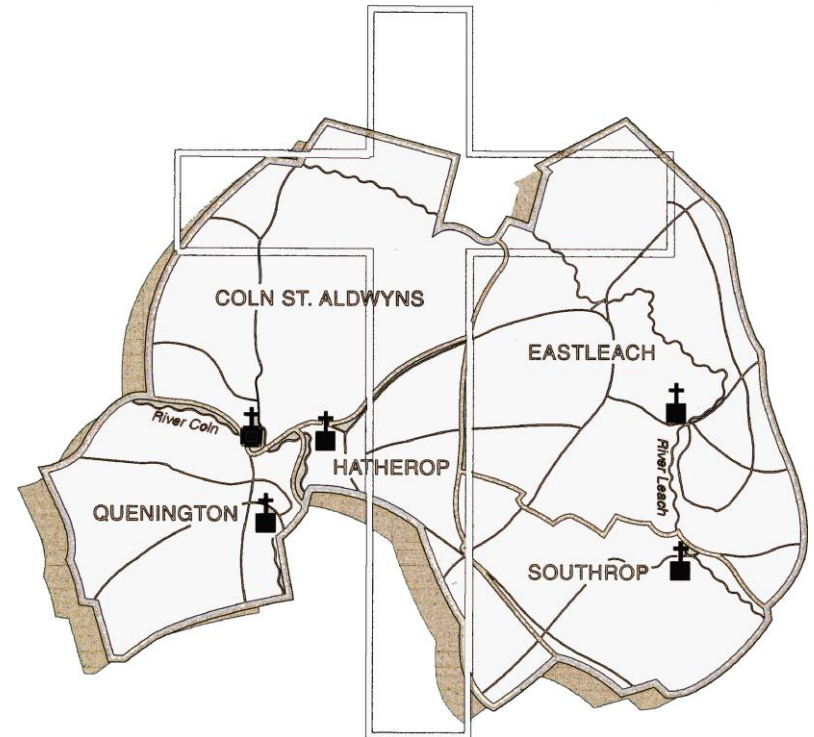

This month many of us will be celebrating the Queen’s Diamond Jubilee. There are lots of events planned to commemorate this historic milestone and to acknowledge her Majesty’s reign, throughout which she has maintained dignity, discretion and diligence. Regardless of our thoughts about the monarchy, it is fitting that together we commemorate and give thanks for her many years of service.

A Jubilee is simply ‘a season for rejoicing’ so we can ask what jubilees are there in our own lives and the lives of those we love? Too often we miss these opportunities to give thanks, to honour and remember – we are too busy to recognise them, and too busy to make time for them. Some of our most important memories are of occasions when we gathered with family and friends for a special event. The year is littered by feast days and excuses for parties which we often miss because of our perpetual rush.

As we enjoy the Queen’s Jubilee we can begin to dream of, and plan other parties – gatherings small or large when we can celebrate what is important us; when we celebrate what makes us who we are. It’s important to give thanks, to honour and to remember. It’s important to rejoice and to party!

May you enjoy the party and find time to celebrate your own jubilees.

## VILLAGE ROUNDUP

### QUENINGTON FETE

We hope you agree that the Quenington Fete was a huge success, the sun even came out for it! We are still finalising the amount of money we raised but we are confident it is a record breaking year so a huge thank you to all those that helped and supported us.

### COLN, HATHEROP AND QUENINGTON PROPOSED PARISH MERGER

These parishes are exploring the possibility of becoming a united parish. Over many years the churches within these villages have worked together to complement and support one another; any proposal will seek to affirm these arrangements and release individuals to support the work of the church and the life of the parishes in other ways.

At present, church law dictates that each Parish has a Parochial Church Council (PCC), plus two Churchwardens and other Officers. For CHQ this means 33 representatives in total. Each PCC functions separately, meaning three lots of meetings at least four times a year; with the Vicar repeating the business in each and much discussion outside of PCC meetings to co-ordinate and complement the life of the individual churches. Such extensive arrangements put a lot of strain on those who want to be involved in the Church, absorbing much of their effort in mundane business.

After consultation between PCCs, we believe that to enable the Church to have a more outward looking place in village life, a simpler formal system is desirable. A parish merger would NOT mean each village loses its Church identity. It would, however, allow the PCC to act in the interests of the villages with a better and quicker process of decision making. As importantly, it would also enable those who are not attracted by formal business affairs to use their talents to help the Church play a more positive part in local life.

We are confident that there are no significant disadvantages to individual Churches; indeed, the proposal reflects the co-operation we have worked with for many years. With equal standing in the joint PCC and freedom to conduct their own activities within villages, the Churches can have a better involvement in our changing society.

## ARE YOU KNEELING COMFORTABLY?

A puffin and a hoopoe are strange creatures to find on church kneelers but they and over seventy other subjects were embroidered by Enid Money, a great gardener and devout Christian, and friend of St Swithins, Quenington. Enid's last work was snowdrops which she picked and embroidered straight onto her tapestry canvas. The swinging sixties taste in the Church of England was neo Arts and Crafts - carpet (blue or red) and nave walls white lime washed, annoyingly outlining the jagged stone surrounds to windows to show the 'natural' stone. Enid Money felt this severe and was impelled to create a colour blazing set of kneelers. Everyone was involved. Volunteers stitched around the main subject on each kneeler. This is an untold story of the sixties in the parishes of England. We are putting this art gallery on show over the Queen's Diamond Jubilee weekend. ## CHEQS FOOTPATH NETWORK

The Ernest Cook Trust is delighted that so many walkers regularly use the vast footpath network across the CHEQS parishes. Some of the footpath and walking routes cross farm land and we ask that walkers respect this by always keeping to marked pathways. Most routes are clearly signed but the entire footpath network can be found on Ordnance Survey Explorer and Landranger Maps. We especially ask that all dogs are kept on leads at all times and gates are closed behind walkers as they leave field boundaries. Please remember that grass is a very important crop for grazing and forage. It is baled and fed to livestock during the winter months. ## RARE PLANTS SALE - QUENINGTON OLD RECTORY

On a cold but sunny spring day in April over 600 visitors attended the Rare Plants Sale at Quenington Old Rectory. **The event raised over £2,000 for the Cobalt Trust based in Cheltenham.** The Cobalt Trust offers state of the art MRI, PET/CT, X-ray and Ultrasound scanning services and also provides education and training, medical research and support for local hospital diagnostic services. Deborah and her husband gave us a delicious tea in the house, where we were able to see more of Deborah's very fine sculptures.
