Slow down

I try to incorporate times of walking into my day as this is the best way for me to reflect and pray, but whenever I take an extended walk I feel a degree of unease. This unease is magnified when I take time off during the working day even when I am working in the evening. As a vicar I am paid a stipend rather than a wage — originally stipends were developed to allow at least one person in a parish to have time for prayer and not be pressured to conform to the pressures of secular employment.

Vicars and the Church in general are not immune to the wider society and can easily be seduced by the cult of overwork, despite ideals that point to another set of values – we are made in God's image and He delights in us because of who we are not because of what we do. I pity Archbishop Rowan and his successor because the demands placed on them and indeed any senior office holder within the church, are unrealistic. They are expected to chronically overwork. The average number of hours worked by people in employment has been creeping up for many years. The advent of smart-phones and 24 hour communication mean some people never take a true day off or holiday completely away from work. Success, achievement, power and position in many professions cannot be attained without overwork. I have heard conversations in which people boast about the long hours they work – but at what cost? Research is clear that overwork leads to a significant decrease in productivity and in addition there are considerable costs to personal health and relationships. We all know what we need to do but we are on a conveyor belt and it's hard to step off. It shouldn't take a crisis for us to re-focus on the things that are truly important. It is a joy to facilitate the 'Parenting Course' and the 'Marriage Course' which provides time for people to step off the conveyor belt and reflect on their most important relationships. The courses affirm and encourage; taking people from where they were to a better place. Nothing within the courses is rocket science, rather they offer simple tried and tested wisdom and good practical advice which will enhance our family life.

May you find time to slow down for that which is most important. Every blessing Craig

ARE YOU KNEELING COMFORTABLY?

A puffin and a hoopoe are strange creatures to find on church kneelers but they and over seventy other subjects were embroidered by Enid Money, a great gardener and devout Christian, and friend of St Swithins, Quenington. Enid 's last work was snowdrops which she picked and embroidered straight onto her tapestry canvas. The swinging sixties taste in the Church of England was neo Arts and Crafts - carpet (blue or red) and nave walls white lime washed, annoyingly outlining the jagged stone surrounds to windows to show the 'natural' stone. Enid Money felt this severe and was impelled to create a colour blazing set of kneelers. Everyone was involved. Volunteers stitched around the main subject on each kneeler. This is an untold story of the sixties in the parishes of England . We are putting this art gallery on show over the Queen's Diamond Jubilee weekend. CHEQS GARDENING CLUB

At our March meeting, we were treated to a very informative talk on Bees by Brigit Strawbridge, who is passionate and knowledgeable on her subject. In Great Britain we have over 250 species of Bee; all are in decline and as we are so dependent on them as pollinators for our crops, this is a serious concern.

We, as Gardeners can do a huge amount to boost their numbers; growing flowers and pollen-rich plants, particularly cottage garden and wildflowers (there are lists of suitable plants on the website- see below) Also providing suitable nesting sites- undisturbed wood piles, compost heaps, bundles of reeds, bamboo or other hollow stems. Leaving some areas of grass un-mown for wildflowers and not using pesticides is also important.

Brigit had identification charts, information leaflets and bee-friendly plants for sale. We all came away feeling infected with her enthusiasm, and determined to do more to help these beautiful and essential insects. www.bumblebeeconservation.org
