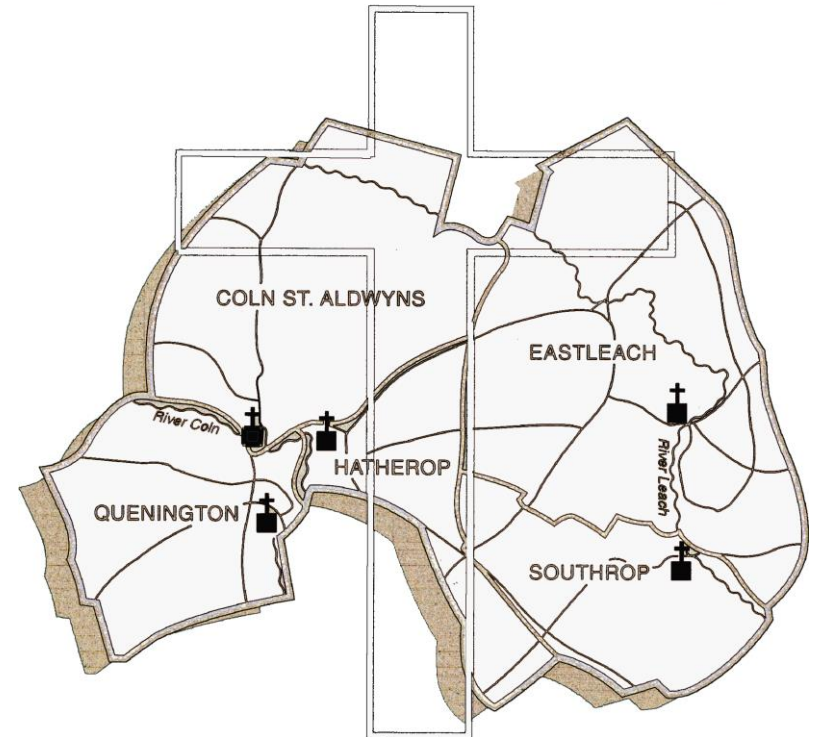

They will run school clubs, lead assemblies and support the schools' teaching. The interns will also run holiday clubs and activity days as well as helping Chris Saunders the youth worker we already employ. The Wessex Male Choir attended the Cheltenham Festival of Arts at the Town Hall in Cheltenham on Saturday 18th May 2013 in order to compete in both the Chamber group and the Male Voice Choir group competitions. The Chamber group were up against strong opposition from six other groups but won their competition with a clear win and were awarded the Price Trophy. The main choir then went on to try their luck with the Male Choir competition and clearly won that section and were awarded the Taylor Trophy. They were put forward for the overall Gold Cup, which compares the winners of the Mixed Choirs, Male Voice Choirs and the Female Choirs winners and won the Gold Cup with a considerable lead over all the other choirs. Wessex Male Choir are delighted with their wins in respect of the Chamber Choir, The Male Voice Choir and the overall Cheltenham Gold Cup and look forward to future competitions in establishing themselves as one of the best Male Choirs in Great Britain.

Someone who can look out for you, who can spend time with you offering friendship and a listening ear.

We are committed to reducing isolation – which is the scourge of our modern society. With an ageing population it's a sad reality that a lot of the older people in our community do not have regular social contact. The repercussions from this are immense and hugely damaging. "Social isolation is associated with a higher risk of death in older people regardless of whether they consider themselves lonely" states a BBC News report. Many researchers have suggested that this is possibly due to the emotional effects of isolation - that feeling lonely is bad for your health. The sad truth is that for those suffering the effects of isolation, the reality is all too evident – and painful. If you've got an hour a week to spare, why not volunteer for us and spend it in the company of someone who will really appreciate your time? You will be making a real difference to someone's life.
