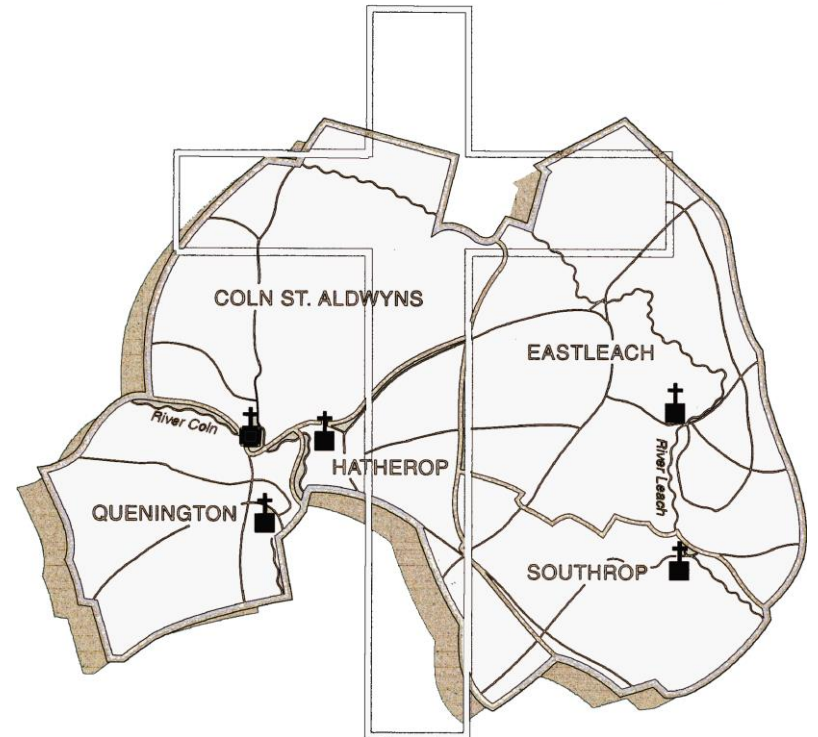

**If you hear a bustle in the hedgerow don't be alarmed now**

The landscape alters quickly not just because of the ever changing seasons but also through travel. In this country the materials and styles of buildings, the form of field boundaries can transform over relatively short distances. Whether travelling a familiar or an unfamiliar route in the country or in a city, the landscape unfolds before you an ever changing tapestry.

Walking is my preferred mode of travel. It seems the right speed for me. Anything quicker and I don't have the time to engage with the rich and varied stimulus that surrounds me. Although I use my other senses it's sight that dominates my experience and memory. I wonder if I'm over dependent on it and if I could somehow enhance and exaggerate my other senses. Occasionally I sit in a wood as the dusk falls. The colours fade and there is a moment when it seems the bird song is turned off: there one moment and gone the next, silence has fallen.

When I was younger I was asked if I could hear bats and being told it would be a finite pleasure for as we age we lose the ability to hear high frequency sounds. What else do we no longer hear? C.S Lewis describes the great lion Aslan singing Narnia into being. The psalmist (98:8) writes, "Let the floods clap their hands; let the hills sing together for joy." whilst the prophet Isaiah (55:12) states, "the mountains and the hills shall burst into song, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands." I sometimes pause to listen but I've never heard these sounds.

Could the universe still be vibrating with the song of creation? A theologian explained the moments in life when we experience peace and know joy by suggesting that at these times we are vibrating in harmony with the world. The actress Jane Fonda when asked to give an explanation of her new found Christian faith said, "I could feel reverence humming in me." I wonder how many other people might respond to that hum if we all slowed a little and sat without agenda in the beauty that surrounds us?

This month and this summer may you find times to pause and to listen, so that you experience more deeply the joy of life.

On Wednesday, June 12th, the Cotswold Decorative & Fine Arts Society will have a lecture entitled "Norman Rockwell: Great American Artist or mere Illustrator?" by John Ericson. Norman Rockwell's work enjoys broad popular appeal in America where he is most famous for the cover illustrations of scenes of everyday life which he created for The Saturday Evening Post. The system locally is run by Val Harvey who on receiving a request from a GP at Hilary Cottage surgery will organise a volunteer driver to collect and deliver the patient to their appointment. Most journeys are quite short, but some travel as far as Gloucester.

Without this scheme, the only alternative for many people is an extremely expensive taxi. Not a good idea for many pensioners.

The scheme has been running successfully for a number of years but there is now an urgent need for more drivers. In the last year the number of volunteers has dropped from 70 to 54. Mainly age taking it's toll as those in their late 70's and 80's no longer feel able to continue.

The more drivers, the easier for Val to organise lifts and the fewer journeys for everyone to take. It is a win win situation.
