

FROM THE VICAR

In the last few weeks we've been celebrating the seventieth anniversary of VE Day. The archbishop at the time, William Temple, one of the outstanding Christian leaders of the last century, had a vision that our nation should put as much effort into the coming peace (by creating a just and compassionate society) as it did into the war that was coming to an end.

Some of his sayings were "It is a great mistake to think that God is chiefly interested in religion", "Knowledge of God can be fully given ... only in a Person, never in a doctrine: faith is not the holding of correct doctrine, but personal fellowship with the living God", and "The Church is the only society on earth that exists for the benefit of non-members." Those (and much else that he said and wrote) are still salutary reminders for us in the CHEQS churches today.

After a couple of months here I've found a great number of opinions (some strongly held, many mutually contradictory) about the internal workings of our churches – their styles of worship, their administrative organization – and only a very little so far about our outward-facing task of sharing the good news of Jesus in word & deed with our neighbours.

With regard to the internal church arrangements that can exercise people so much, we'll be looking at all these things in our church council meetings. Across CHEQS we'll be agreeing a worship policy to try to meet people's wide range of hopes and fears (you can find a draft at www.cheqs.church/downloads), and we'll be looking at ways of streamlining our churches' structures (especially in the recently united CHQ parish) to free time and energy for our wider mission.

But more than that I want us to focus our energy on serving others in the name of Jesus. There are so many great needs in the world around us, and we need to be at the forefront of caring for those involved. Internationally, we need to engage with the poorest, through agencies such as Christian Aid; and closer to home we need to look at all that we do, with a view to making it as relevant as possible to those who do not yet know God's love for us in Jesus.

As a small start, have you given yet to the earthquake relief in Nepal? The Disasters Emergency Committee is co-ordinating the UK charities' response, and if you put an envelope marked 'Nepal' in any of our church collections, we'll make sure that the contents are passed on to them.

NEWS FROM LITTLE OWLS NURSERY AT HATHEROP CASTLE

The sun shone down on the Nursery children and their teddy bears as they went off through the woods for a picnic on our recent Stay and Play event. Visitors and their teddies had the opportunity to ice teddy biscuits, make teddy bear masks and join in some singing and dancing with their bears before setting off for the picnic where they were all treated to delicious honey sandwiches and a selection of fruit. A trail of bear paw prints led the assembled party to the outdoor classroom where everyone and their bear listened to stories read by the Headmaster. There will be further opportunities to Stay and Play in the Nursery next term so do contact the school for information.

The children in the Transition class are all very excited about their forthcoming trip to Winchcombe Station for a ride on the steam train this week. They are taking with them a packed lunch to eat on the train and I have no doubt they will be full of things to tell me on their return.

It is never too early to raise money for charity and this year the Nursery children will all be involved in a sponsored toddle in aid of Dr Barnardo's. Dressed as pirates they will be striding out on a trail around the school grounds later this term and hope to raise a large sum for this important charity.

Daily life is always busy and exciting for the children. This term we have introduced Forest School learning for the entire Nursery. This means, once a week, putting on outdoor clothing and walking to our designated Forest School area here at the Castle. Outdoor learning is a brilliant way to engage the children in all sorts of activities, from measuring the length of different sticks; comparing the different shapes of leaves; counting fircones; looking for minibeasts; gaining control and coordination by balancing on logs or just enjoying the experience of listening to the wind in the trees, the list is endless and the opportunities for learning limitless.

The older children in Nursery are involved in the Pre-Prep production this term and are practicing their songs ready to perform the Animal Rumble Grumble to their parents and friends just before Half Term. The performing arts are one of the strengths of Hatherop Castle and starting early gives the children the opportunity to gradually gain confidence and to develop a belief in their own abilities, leading to a sense of achievement and pride in what they are able to do. All of which are vital qualities for success later in life.

The transition to the Reception class and full time schooling is fast approaching and the children are already being prepared for this important step in their lives by spending time each week in Reception. This means that when the time comes in September they will already be familiar with the Pre-Prep staff and the classrooms. Likewise the children about to enter Nursery in September have fun each week in our parent and toddler group which takes place every Friday from 9.00 to 10.30am. Do come along and join in if you have any toddlers at home in need of entertainment. We love welcoming new children to the group and there are always plenty of things to do including all those messy activities that they love.
