And although things have changed, Mothering Sunday is still the day when we say "thank you" to our mothers for everything they do; for their care, for their patience and most of all for their unquestioning love.

For us in these villages there is an extra cause for celebration on March 15<sup>th</sup>. We have been without a vicar for getting on for a year since Craig and his family moved to Chipping Camden, but on that Sunday afternoon we officially welcome our new vicar, John Partington, and his wife Liz at a service in Hatherop church. John is writing elsewhere in this magazine and he, like those who have held the post before him, isn't here just for those who go to church but for the whole community.

So on that day especially, please pray for John and Liz, please pray for your mothers and all others who love you – and pray for yourselves both in happiness and need because God is always listening.

## **CHANGING TECHNOLOGY AT HATHEROP CASTLE SCHOOL**

Technology and the internet change rapidly and in a school setting the need to stay up to date with current issues is key to ensuring a happy and safe environment for children to use the technology available to them. Internet Safety Day 2015 saw children at Hatherop Castle highlight what the internet can do for us at school and at home, whilst also ensuring awareness of what we must all do to keep safe online. The children gave ideas for our top tips for online safety and how we can show the same respect for people online that we do offline. It is not just the online world that quickly moves forward. In the very same week we held our Internet Safety Day, Year 2 children were writing their own computer programs as they learned about new ways of coding, Year 4 children were using the 3D printer to print castles they had designed with computer aided design software, whilst Year 7 and 8 were learning about how to use the suite of new Apple Mac computers that have recently been installed to compliment learning opportunities already available on Windows machines.

At Hatherop Castle the children are relishing the challenges and opportunities they face as they move forward in this new world of technology.
